when iraq invaded kuwait in 1990 the sight of tens of thousands of non kuwaiti arabs indians east asians and westerners fleeing or trapped under occupation made the outside world suddenly aware of a singular fact of kuwaiti society that kuwaitis are an absolute minority in their own country basing her analysis on extensive fieldwork and archiv

the individual in international law collects the work of esteemed scholars to examine the effects of humanisation on international law and how individual status rights and obligations have changed the international legal system throughout history and into the present day

this monograph explores and investigates narratives of physical psychological and emotional dislocation that take place within the arab world approaching them as manifestations of the arabic word ghurba or estrangement as a feeling and state of being distancing itself from the centrality of the west in postcolonial and arabic literary studies the book explores experiences of migration displacement and cosmopolitanism that do not directly ensue from the encounter with europe or the european other covering texts from the levant egypt the arabian peninsula and beyond from the 19th 20th and 21st centuries the book grounds narratives of dislocation in the political social and cultural structures that affect the everyday lived experiences of individuals and communities an analysis of arabic turkish and english texts encompassing fiction memoirs and translations highlights less visible narratives of ghurba specifically amongst ethnic minorities and religious communities ultimately the chapters contribute to a picture of the arab world as a place of ghurba where mobile and immobile subjects foreigners and local inhabitants alike encounter alienation bringing together a diverse range of academic perspectives the book will be of interest to students and scholars in postcolonial and comparative literary studies history and arabic and middle east studies

the fuglerud study is a prototype for any anthropologist or political scientist working on a politicised radicalised diaspora ethnic conflict research digest this book about a recent immigrant group sri lankan tamils in a european liberal democracy norway is paradigmatic for how the anthropology of a displaced population ought to be done anywhere in the western world based on extensive field research in norway and brief but insightful research in sri lanka life on the outside is an elegant and effective blend of theory and ethnography one of the very best in refugee studies to date e valentine daniel columbia university this study of the tamil diaspora is one of the first full ethnographic studies of a post colonial migrant community and a major contribution to the study of migration globalisation identity politics and long distance nationalism from an anthropological perspective fuglerud s study traces the history of tamil migration from the arrival of the economic migrants of the 1960s to the asylum seekers of the mid 1980s onwards he draws unnerving parallels between the status of the tamil community in sri lanka as a beleaguered and persecuted minority waging a war of liberation and as a displaced marginalised and excluded refugee community fuglerud argues that in the process of displacement particular aspects of tamil culture marriage dowry chastity and ritual acquire a heightened significance he examines the contradictions and inconsistencies which characterise the tamil refugee communities and the success of revolutionary tamil nationalism in exile highlighting the transnational nature of identity politics

when compared to studies of the indian diaspora or even in the wider framework of diaspora studies there is relatively meagre research about the pakistani diaspora this collection is the first to bring together the extant literature and provide both a historical and contemporary set of accounts it is primarily about the processes associated with migration and settlement as seen from the receiving end

even though roger ballard and junaid rana offer accounts of pakistan s political economy it is only in frances watkins chapter that migrant voices within pakistan themselves speak even in this chapter their life stories are focused on the impact of migration though given the transnational frame in which many pakistani diasporic communities live it is not really possible to solely focus on the place of settlement indeed the shift from migration studies to transnational or diaspora research reflects the empirical reality of a non linear dynamics inherent in migratory movements historically the notion that people move and settle in a sequential and traceable manner has been rightly disputed and the circular nature of migratory movements has come to the fore even though the issues that are raised in the majority of the chapters are concerned with adaptation and change in new environments these are always linked or referenced to a transnational frame
